Anyone who has read Mr Denys Peter Myers' Book "Gaslighting in 51 America" must have noticed the myriad of gasoliers pictured with the <u>wrong</u> shades !!! Early gasoliers Circa 1820 to 1860 simply did not have 4" gas fitter shades as they did at the turn of the century. During this earlier time, the standard was 2 5/8" fitters. So, when we set out to make the best reproduction Starr-Fellows lights in America, we immediately hit the shade obstacle. The only solution was to reproduce those too! Ours are 8% lead crystal and really free hand cut without auto-tracing cutters or jigs. This gives a somewhat wavy cut which is typical of old shades and the correct ambience for our fixtures.
